### 1. IN THE ROUND

This is a timeless piece made from oak burl that has a wonderfully handy storage space in the centre, meaning it could double up as a secret mini bar as well. Any **coffee table**, price on request, Emmanuelle Simon

### 2. BRANCHING OUT

The whimsical creatures sitting on branches are all moulded in clay before being cast in bronze. I know I'd end up hanging my necklaces off the stems to give the piece a personalised touch. Midwinter **table lamp**, £5,460, Laura Carlin at The New Craftsmen

### 3. CENTREPIECE

These candles, handcrafted in Mexico, have a wide base so they can stand alone, giving a contemporary finish. Paleta **candles**, £38 for two, NILE at The Conran Shop

### 4. SEEING GREEN

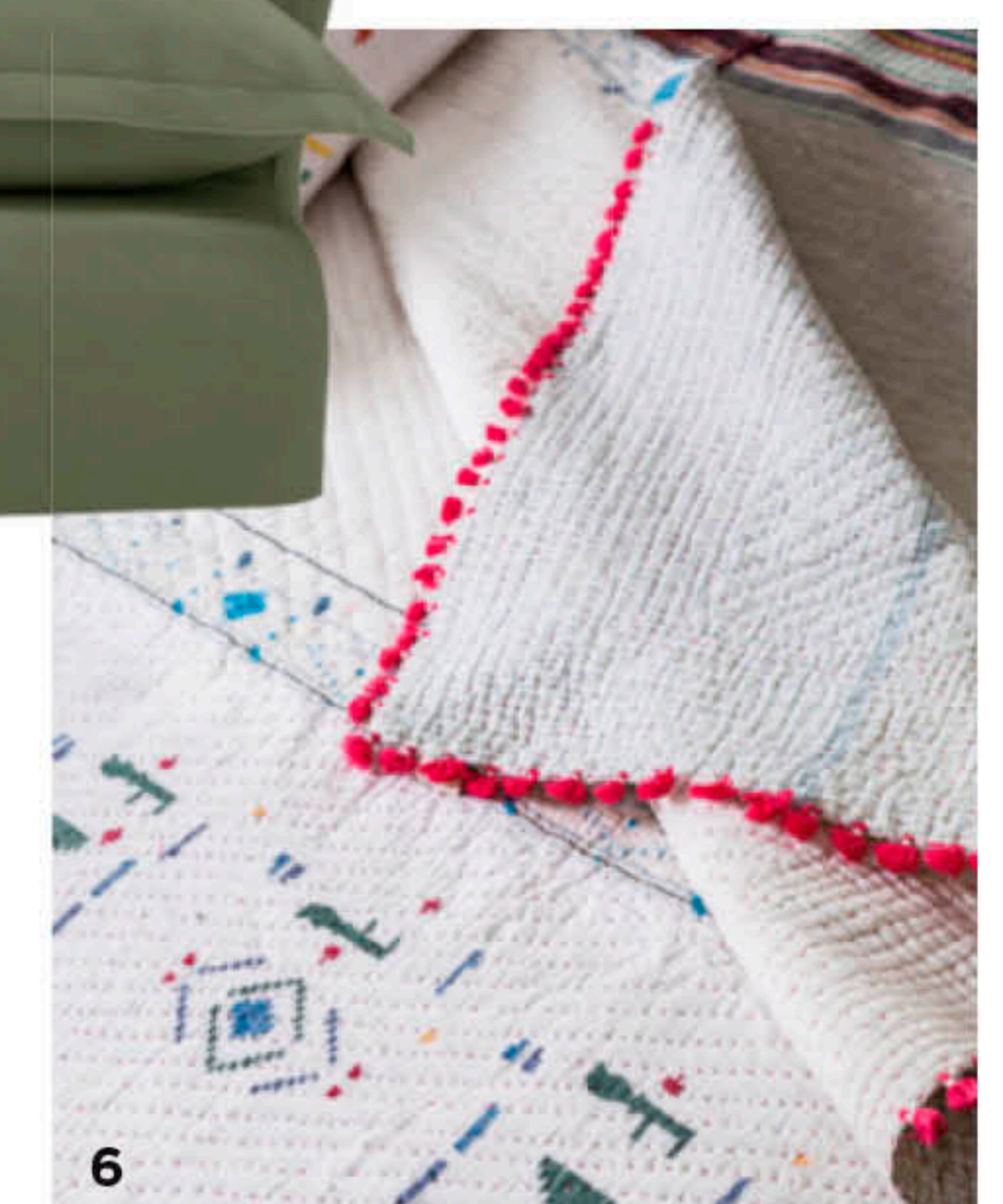
